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SENS / Noémie Lafrance announces its Annual Gala Benefit to take place on Thursday, June 16, 2005 at Studio 450 including Dinner, Cocktails, DJ After-party, and three exclusive excerpts from performances of Lafrance's latest work Migrations, and upcoming work, Agora. Dress code for this sexy summery event at Studio 450, an elegant rooftop on the Hudson featuring a 360 degree view of the city, is flamboyant, transparent and iridescent. Honorary Committee Members include Laurie Anderson, Robert Wilson, David R. White, Schuyler Chapin, Congresswoman Nydia Velázquez, and New York City Council Members Diana Reyna and David Yassky. Sponsors include Biche de Bere, Monkey Town, Quebec House, Altria Group Inc., Vino, and Studio 450; Agora is made possible, in part, by public funds from New York City Department of Cultural Affairs, The New York State Council on the Arts, a state agency, and the National Endowment for the Arts.

SENS / Noémie Lafrance is an award-winning non-profit experimental arts organization founded in 2000. SENS' mission is to create and produce innovative site-specific dance performances that both engage audiences in spatial participation and explore the dynamic of movement in public spaces by integrating choreography into urban architecture. Since inception, SENS has produced the acclaimed Descent (2 Bessie Awards, 10 Best Dance Performances of 2002 by the NY Times), Melt and Noir (2004 Whitney Biennial). Recent commissions include Neuberger Museum of Art, Unseen: Landscape, and Whitney Museum at Altria, Migrations created as part of the Resonant Space performance series in Spring 2005.

The 2005 Annual Gala Benefit will help support Noémie Lafrance's new upcoming work Agora, which will take place in the historical McCarren Pool in September 2005. Agora is a site-specific dance performance inspired by the McCarren Pool site and performed by 30 dancers to a multi-channel score with theatrical lighting transforming the 50, 000 square foot pool into a vast staging area. Performed inside the large pool, the overlapping narrative segments of Agora will produce the illusion of travel through the different layers of visceral urban experience and explore the phenomenon of agoraphobia as a social and physical reaction to urban architecture. This artistic project is the first step in reopening the magnificent McCarren Pool site as both a cultural and recreational facility for the public and the community of Williamsburg/Greenpoint and the New York City metropolitan area.
