

THE RAPTURE SERIES

celebrates **Frank Gehry**'s architecture in movement with site-specific dance installations by choreographer **Noémie Lafrance** performed on ten Gehry-designed buildings worldwide.

Staged on the exterior surface of Gehry buildings, the *Rapture* performances feature dancers traveling across the roofs and walls using custom rigging systems and video mapping projections to reveal the dynamics of the architecture's curves in motion.

This groundbreaking series by visionary site-specific choreographer Noémie Lafrance, features dance installations created for ten selected Gehry buildings in response to their architecture. First performed on the Fisher Center for the Performing Arts at Bard College in 2008, the ten *Rapture* performances form a series of public works that bring elements of choreography, architecture, contemporary arts and film together in a new artistic hybrid.

The multi-city 5-year project will include performance runs of up to four weeks in each of the ten metropolitan cities to be attended by an audience of 20,000 per city, reaching over 200,000 constituents and millions of impressions worldwide. The first ever sitespecific work of this scale estimated at \$5,000,0000, initiates a new funding model to support the not-for-profit art project. The *Series'* funding scheme will include box office revenues, sponsorships, private/public funding and creative merchandise such as a short film collection, books, photographs, and other derivative artistic products.



INSPIRATION

The undulating shapes elevated between earth and sky, created by Gehry are of pure movement essence; evoking the lightness of clouds or the weight of eroded hills and valleys, they inspired the creation of *Rapture*. Like an ascent into the sky or a descent on earth, "rapture" is an act of seizing, carrying off, or transporting one from one state to another. Suspended in between two states, two places or two moments, *Rapture* transcends the architecture's inherent movement into physical motion.

CHOREOGRAPHY

Based on concepts of repetition, evolution and accumulation, the choreography will create an orchestration of rhythms and patterns in response to topography that reveal the dynamics of the architecture's curvilinear structure. Through gravity defying physicality, dancers will travel across the outside surface of the building's roofs and walls, expressing its ecstasy, lightness and freedom. The distinct choreographic language will trace the architecture and redefine the perception-altering structure in movement, making the man-made landscape sing.



Original music composed for *Rapture Series* will blend live orchestrated classical scores with pre-recorded electronic music. A composition of found sound inspired by the metallic structures will be created for each building by award-winning composer Janek Schaefer (*AudiOH! Recordings*) and overlapped with classical arrangements by Michael Jennings (*Massive Attack*) performed by a live orchestra.

RIGGING

Gravity Design will provide custom rigging for *The Rapture Series*. Gravity Design, (*Cirque du Soleil, Bandaloop*) is the industry leaders in custom installations for dance and circus. They specialize in setups that are retrofit to existing structures using kinetic rigging with force management involving live loads (people). Each rigging systems is designed for specific sections of a building and is manually operated by riggers during the performance. Dancers are retained by ropes that allows them to perform on the outside walls of the buildings with a different response to gravity depending on the area's specific topography.

PROJECTIONS

Using the latest 3D video mapping technology, we will create unique visuals that will be projected onto the buildings and interact with the dancers and the architecture. Video mapping involves an extensive architectural mapping of an original structure so as to overlay a 3D moving image on the surface of the structure and create the illusion that the structure is moving. This will allow us to superimpose bodies and architecture in motion. Combining 3D animated and original footage will offer a spectacular range of possibilities for interaction with the choreography, resulting in a sensory experience enlivening the building in multiple dimensions.





NOÉMIE LAFRANCE

Noémie Lafrance is an acclaimed site-specific Choreographer, Director and Producer known for her innovative use of public spaces and architecture. Her work both reclaiming the public space and creating interactive theatrical experiences was said, by *La Presse*, to have "changed the fabric of New York City". Lafrance's large-scale dance installations invite audiences to immerse themselves in the architecture of their city, and offer them new vantage points from which to view the world.

Her epic work *Agora* was seen by over 15,000 in New York City and reopened the McCarren Park Pool site to the public. Staged in a stairwell designed by Stanford White, her signature work *Descent*, recipient of 2 **Bessie Awards**, was named "best performance of the year" in **The New York Times** and **Time Out NY**, and was performed over 80 times in NYC.

Lafrance is a recipient of a **MVPA award** for the choreography of Feist's *"1,2,3,4"* music video, which was nominated for a **Grammy Award** and several awards internationally. She is a **Lambent fellow**, and her work was presented and received awards in prestigious festivals and venues internationally including the **Whitney Biennial**, **Festival TransAmérique**, and **Festival de Cannes**. She has also choreographed for opera, visual arts, film and television, collaborating with prominent artists such as Feist, David Byrne, Doug Aitken, Patrick Daughters, and many others.




SENS PRODUCTION

FRANK GEHRY

Frank Gehry is a Canadian American *Pritzker Prize*-winning architect based in Los Angeles, California. His buildings, including his private residence, have become tourist attractions. His works often are cited as being among the most important works of contemporary architecture in the 2010 World Architecture Survey, which led Vanity Fair to label him as "the most important architect of our age".

The belief that "architecture is art" has been a part of Frank Gehry's being for as long as he can remember. In fact, when asked if he had any mentors or idols in the history of architecture, his reply was to pick up a Brancusi photograph on his desk, saying, "Actually, I tend to think more in terms of artists like this. He has had more influence on my work than most architects. In fact, someone suggested that my skyscraper that won a New York competition looked like a Brancusi sculpture. I could name Alvar Aalto from the architecture world as someone for whom I have great respect, and of course, Philip Johnson."
